- Two Gas buy-downs where we paid down the price of gas to \$1.99 for the city of Katy (back when gas was \$4.00 per gallon)
- Food & Supply Drive for KCM - Single largest donation of food, personal products and diaper to KCM that they have received this year
- Promotion of World Vision where our church adopted over 100 children in third world countries
- Youth Mission trip to San Antonio
- Two Adult Mission trips to Mexico
- 3 Teams served to help clean-up after Hurricane Ike
- Monthly financial support of foreign missions
